#### **Magdale Land**

A major project during the last few months has been the construction of a Bee Bank above the orchard. A small group of volunteers embarked on a journey of research to create a perfect design. In just a week during the beginning of October, this eco-friendly haven was built and we thank them all for their hard work and commitment. But what's the buzz all about, you might ask? The Bee Bank is here to encourage solitary bees, of which there are nearly 250 species in the UK. Solitary bees create short tunnels in which the females lay their eggs. They carry out a vital role in pollinating our crops, flowers and trees ensuring a thriving orchard and vibrant wildflowers in the future. This project was funded by a grant from Natural Kirklees. If you are a dog owner, we kindly request that you keep your furry friends off the Bee Bank so it can establish itself properly. We want it to flourish and become a welcome home for these precious pollinators.



In August, the grass was cut, and thanks to the River Holme Connections volunteers we were able to sow wildflower seeds gathered from Magdale and a local site of Special Scientific Interest (SSI). We are hopeful to see the fruits of their labor in the

coming years. In our Oak woodland, we also planted a variety of wildflower bulbs. During August and September, we started work on clearing the undergrowth along the goit from the Mag to the Dam. We made great progress, but there's still more to do.

Our volunteers did an amazing job completing the steps up the banking from the River Holme to Magdale Fields, providing a rope support to assist walkers using this route. In October we had an Arboricultural Consultant assess the safety of the trees on Magdale. There is no immediate action needed, but we do have some tree work planned to reduce any potential risk from falling branches or trees. We're working on a schedule to tackle this over the next year. Thank you to Holme



Valley Parish Council who funded the Tree safety survey. Looking ahead to the New Year we hope to collaborate with Eden Forest CIC to improve the paths along Magdale Dam, introduce more marginal plants and create floating fish refuges which will include lilies. This work will be supported by grants from Holme Valley Parish Council (already approved) and the Environment Agency (awaiting approval). Shortly we'll be unveiling a map of Magdale and its various tracks, so you can explore our beautiful slice of nature even more easily. It'll be posted on our noticeboards and website. We can't express enough gratitude for our incredible volunteers, who make all of this possible. We're always open to welcoming new faces, so if you'd like to join us on the second Sunday of each month, please don't hesitate to get in touch. You'll find all the important dates on the noticeboards at Magdale.


