further details) including a site called **Swinden Knowl**. This small triangular plot lies midway between Honley, Wilshaw and Netherthong at the summit of Bradshaw Road where it becomes Knoll Lane. We are keen to make better use of this land and welcome any views from local community groups or organisations who have ideas for its potential use. Legally, it is 'common land' restricting what is possible but we can discuss these further with any interested parties. At last! After five years of negotiation, Honley Library Asset Transfer is completed. The building is now owned by Holme Valley Parish Council with a 25 year lease to Friends of Honley library.

■ Going Hydro Electric at Magdale Weir

Magdale Weir was originally built to raise the water level of the Mag Brook feeding a small channel leading to the water wheel at Lower Steppes Mill. Recently The Village Trust received a grant from The Bright Green Community Fund to undertake a feasibility study for a possible Hydro Electric Turbine at Magdale Weir. A team of students from Sheffield University are engaged in the project together with engineers from Holmfirth Transit Towns Group, local volunteers, and The River Holme Connections Group. This study has also raised interest in generating a fish pass allowing fish to spawn in the upper reaches of the River Holme currently they are unable to pass.

The ancient water management system of channels and sluice gates at Magdale Fields is an important part of our industrial heritage originally built in the early 1700's at the time of George IV and the American war of independence. In recent years the Village Trust's Land Volunteers have upgraded the sluice gate mechanisms with the help of apprentices from Holset Engineering (Cummins) in Huddersfield.

A special thanks to all the local volunteers who have assisted this project, especially Billy Hogg, Jack Edwards & Alan Brooke, River Holme Connections Group, Holmfirth Transit Towns Group & the students from Sheffield University.

Planting New Life into Magdale

In December 2022 we planted Alder, Birch and Willow trees on Magdale. However, the main tree was an Oak Tree in remembrance of Ian Blagborough, planted by family and friends in the centre of one of the fields. Many people in Honley knew Ian and were aware of his significant contribution to the preservation work on Magdale over many years. We hope this will be a lasting memory and remind us of the impact he made during his stewardship of this conservation area.

Our annual clearance of leaves along Spider Alley and Lovers walk was much appreciated by many people who use these paths, it prevents them becoming hazardous to walkers of all ages. We have continued to thin the holly in the oak woodland and hope the extra light into the woodland will result in dormant spring flowers coming through.



We have continued with some clearance work in Southgate Woods prior to planting trees at the end of the year. In the coming months we will carry on with our maintenance work but will also add to the orchard by planting some pear trees and crab apple trees.

We aim to erect noticeboards at the

two main entrances to Magdale so that we can display more information on the work that we are undertaking. A cause for celebration

In the Spring of 1993 a rumour flew around Honley that Magdale Fields was to be sold for housing development. This local beauty spot is an area of natural countryside with rivers and woodlands so close to the centre of the village, the pride of the inhabitants and beloved by local walkers and visitors. Almost immediately meetings were held, a committee formed, the landowner was contacted and the land purchased. An anonymous benefactor provided a loan and Magdale Fields was secured in perpetuity for the enjoyment of the people of Honley. The new committee contacted the Charity Commission and by Autumn of that year a brand new Charity was born namely 'Honley Village Community Trust'. Everybody in the village was asked to become a member of the new Charity at a membership fee of one pound and by holding raffles and fund raising events the money was paid back to the benefactor in a very short time. To this day the membership fee has remained at One Pound. Later this year we intend to celebrate our 30 years of service to Honley - keep a look out for more info coming soon.
