Magdale Land Report

Honley Community Orchard is continuing to thrive and the use of weed suppressant mats and mulching has helped the trees to cope with the dry June before the much wetter July. We have removed any apples that were growing to encourage growth in the trees and will do this for another two years in the hope that this produces more fruit in the long term. The warm and dry June saw a significant amount of algae appear on Magdale Dam. This was raked out where possible by Eden Forest fishermen, but then it quickly disappeared once the weather cooled and we had more frequent rain. We will consider measures to mitigate the risk of future algae blooms in view of climate

change. Our volunteers are constructing steps up the banking from the sluice gate on the River Holme up to the field above to make this a more accessible path for people. Other tasks completed have included refurbishing the benches, pathway clearance and further clearance work at

Southgate Woods.



Some people have commented to me about the Oak tree planted in memory of Ian Blagborough. Unfortunately it has not survived being transplanted to its location on Magdale despite regular watering during our dry spell.




I have been advised that Oaks can be a bit temperamental when transplanted. Another tree is being supplied in the Autumn and we hope for better luck next time. One of our projects during the next few months is the creation of a Bee Bank for solitary bees to be located close to the orchard. We are looking forward to getting started on this. Thanks to all of the volunteers for their hard work on Magdale, we couldn't do it without you. We always welcome new

Honley Probus Club


The Probus Club meets every 1st and 3rd Tuesday of each month at Honley Community Centre on Long Lane.
